A motion to approve the consent agenda was made by Schnede with a second by Rohling. All ayes.

The **Clinton County Sheriff Department** spent 60.77 hours in the City of Wheatland from May 26, 2007 through June 25, 2007 while they were on patrol they issued 1 warning, 1 citation, answered 16 calls and handled 7 incidents.

During the **update on the construction of the wastewater treatment facility**Steve Thompson of MSA Professionals was present to inform the council that work is continuing at a steady pace, weather permitting the plant will be up and running soon. Thompson requested that the City sign a contract for \$11,900.00 to cover MSA Professionals construction management. The original contract for \$43,000.00 was for a six month period which expired approximately 3 months ago. A motion to approve the contract for \$11,900.00 was made by Prachar with a second by Schnede. All ayes.

A motion to approve the parade route for **Calamus Wheatland High School Homecoming** on September 20, 2007 was made by Rohling with a second by Prachar. All aves.

During **public forum** Mayor Bopp informed those present that he has posted a notice on F & B Communications information channel regarding citizens allowing out of town people to bring garbage in to town for disposal. This is considered stealing services and is a punishable crime. The Park Board will be installing an outfield fence at the City ball diamond on July 28, 2007. Anyone interested in helping install the fence should contact Century Schnede.

Cheryl Kastantin was present to request the Council consider implementing a **fence ordinance for swimming pools.** Ganzer will get copies of ordinances from other cities to give the Council ideas for writing an ordinance for Wheatland.

Barb Gerber was present to discuss the drainage problem on the south side of East Jefferson Street from Main to Bennett. Schnede will meet with engineers on July 19, 2007 to discuss curb and gutter to rectify the problem. Schnede requested that Gerber take pictures of the problem so that we can possibly apply for grants for the project.

A motion to **appoint Jennie Brinkman to the Park Board** was made by Schnede with a second by Prachar. All ayes.

A motion to allow the **Girl Scouts to paint the bridge rails** at Jefferson and Toronto and Washington and Toronto was made by Schnede with a second by Rohling. All ayes.

The issue with raccoons residing at 212 S. Main Street was settled prior to the meeting.

A motion to allow Main Street Pizza to close Main Street from Madison to Jefferson and Jefferson from the east side of JR's Place to the west side of the Community Center for the Eastern lowa Pizza Games on October 6, 2007 was made by Schnede with a second by Rohling. All ayes.

A motion to **accept the land from Alliant Energy** where the old power plant was located was made by Schnede with a second by Prachar. All ayes.

A motion to allow **Wheatland Manor to drive citizens around Wheatland on golf carts** on July 17, 2007 was made by Schnede with a second by Rohling. All ayes. The permission extends to any rain date that may need to be set.

A motion to **approve resolution 2008-01** which is for purchasing certificates of deposit for the 2008 fiscal year for fire truck, maintenance truck and economic development savings was made by Schnede with a second by Rohling. All ayes.

A motion to **approve resolution 2008-02** which is for donating \$5,000.00 to the Sesquicentennial Committee for the 2008 celebration.

A motion to **approve a lease agreement with Taylor Construction** to allow their job trailer to remain on site until no later than May 31, 2008 was made by Schnede with a second by Prachar. Prachar and Schnede aye. Rohling nay.

A motion to **approve the request for a credit of \$21.12 on account 17000** for swimming pool fill was made by Prachar with a second by Schnede. All ayes.

A motion to approve the request for a credit of \$19.80 on account 157400 for swimming pool fill was made by Prachar with a second by Schnede. All ayes

During **reports** Mayor Bopp noted that he has received tentative approval from the Governor's office for the Governor to attend our Sesquicentennial in 2008. Ganzer noted that the Consumer Confidence Report for water quality has been posted at the Post Office and City Hall and was published in the Observer on June 27, 2007. Jayson noted that the water tower painting and cleaning has been completed. Rohling noted that there was automotive glass in the street by JR's Place and asked Jayson to remove it.

A motion to adjourn at 7:30 was made by Rohling with a second by Schnede. All ayes.
